Admissions information

Concord has three first year class starts each year. Concord does not require applicants to its JD program to sit for the LSAT, but Concord has its own 40-question online admissions test with a minimum score requirement. Approximately 60% of applicants who undertake the online test are disqualified from applying for not meeting required cut scores.

Of those who met the cut score:

75th percentile was 32

50th percentile was 28

25th percentage was 26

Employment Outcomes

The employment data reported below was compiled from a survey of graduates of Concord's Juris Doctor program. Because Concord is required to report survey results for employment for each of the first three years after graduation, Concord is reporting survey results for its 2013 graduates.

Ninety-two surveys were sent out and 31 graduates responded, for an overall response rate of 33.7%. The percentages for those who are employed in a position where a JD is required or a JD is an advantage are expressed as a percentage of all respondents who reported being employed. For example, 22 out of 31 respondents reported being employed in 2014. Of these 22 employed graduates, 22.73% reported being employed in a position where a JD was required and 36.36% reported being employed in a position where a JD was an advantage.

Bar Pass Information

Concord Law School is in the Registered Law School category and as such, the State Bar of California does not report a cumulative pass rate for Concord graduates. However, Concord has been maintaining its own 5-year rolling average of the pass rates for graduates from the previous five years. As of the July 2015 California Bar Exam, when the State Bar was still providing a pass/fail list by graduate to California law schools, Concord had 325 unique takers sit for the exam and 145 passed, for a five year pass rate of 44.62%.

In 2016, the State Bar no longer provided bar exam information to law schools by individual graduates. Although Concord received aggregate pass/fail information based upon all Concord graduates who sat for the February 2016 bar exam, Concord had to undertake a survey of graduates who may have sat for the February 2016 bar exam to obtain individual pass/fail information. Based upon the survey results, for the five year rolling average including the February 2016 bar exam, there are 281 unique takers and 131 passer for a five year pass rate of 46.62%.

A survey of graduates who may have sat for the July 2016 bar exam is in process at this time and this information will be updated after survey results are compiled.
