

Concord Law School Scholarship

Concord Law School at Kaplan University has established the Concord Law School Scholarship for new students enrolling in Concord's Juris Doctor and Executive Juris Doctor programs.

Award

The Concord Law School Scholarship is equal to a \$1,250 per-term tuition reduction, with a maximum value of \$10,000 for a Juris Doctor degree or \$7,500 for an Executive Juris Doctor degree.

Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a first-time enrollee in the Juris Doctor or Executive Juris Doctor degree program at Concord Law School at Kaplan University.
- For the Juris Doctor degree program, must meet all Concord admissions requirements, including a bachelor's degree from a regionally or nationally accredited institution recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and recognized by the Committee of Bar Examiners of the State Bar of California.
- For the Executive Juris Doctor degree program, must meet all Concord admissions requirements, including a bachelor's degree from a regionally or nationally accredited institution recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
- Must be fully accepted into the program.
- Must provide an officially verified LSAT score of 154 or above or achieve a score of 34 on the Concord Admissions Test.
- Must complete and submit the Concord Law School Scholarship application, including a writing exercise based on a problem type commonly used on the LSAT.
- Must prepare a statement describing the reasons for the scholarship applicant's interest in Concord.
- Must start courses in the first term.
- Students with prior law school or moral character issues may not be eligible for the Scholarship.

Other Terms and Conditions

- Selection of the award recipients is made by Concord Law School at Kaplan University. All applicants agree to accept the decision of Concord Law School at Kaplan University as final.
- An official transcript from the applicant's bachelor's degree must be provided prior to enrollment. If the transcript is not provided prior to enrollment, the student will not be eligible for the Concord Law School Scholarship and will be responsible for full tuition costs.
- If the student meets all eligibility criteria to qualify, the Scholarship award of \$1,250.00 will be applied at the beginning of each term for as long as the student qualifies. The Scholarship will be applied up to a maximum value of \$10,000 toward the Juris Doctor degree program and \$7,500 toward the Executive Juris Doctor degree program.
- Juris Doctor scholarship students who change to the Executive Juris Doctor program may maintain scholarship eligibility if they are in compliance with the Executive Juris Doctor requirements for continued eligibility.
- The Scholarship cannot be used in conjunction with any other Concord Law School at Kaplan University tuition reductions (including active-duty and veterans military tuition rates), grants, vouchers, or other scholarships with the exception of the Concord Paid-in-Full tuition reduction. Employees of Kaplan, Inc., and its subsidiaries, and their spouses or children are not eligible.

Continued Eligibility:

- To remain eligible after the first two terms, Juris Doctor students must pass the First-Year Law Students' Examination (FYLSE) on their first eligible attempt. The Scholarship will not be applied to the third term until passage of the first administration of the FYLSE is confirmed.
- To remain eligible after the first two terms, Executive Juris Doctor students must remain continuously enrolled in full-time status and be on schedule to complete the Executive Juris Doctor program in six consecutive terms.
- Students must consistently maintain a CGPA of 3.0 out of 4.0 starting in the third term and for the duration of their program at Concord Law School at Kaplan University to maintain the award. If the student was awarded the Scholarship and does not maintain the required CGPA, he or she will not be eligible to receive the Scholarship. This can result in an out-of-pocket payment.
- Must remain in good financial standing with Kaplan University.
- All required documents must be on file at Kaplan University for the Scholarship to be awarded.
- Must be continuously enrolled at Concord Law School at Kaplan University. Students who withdraw or take a non-school-mandated break in studies that includes an academic leave of absence will no longer be eligible for the Concord Law School Scholarship.

Notes:

1. Scholarship disbursement eligibility cannot be regained by the student once it is lost.
2. Concord Law School at Kaplan University reserves the right to amend scholarship policies or awards, or discontinue granting scholarships to additional students at any time.
